The regular meeting of the Honesdale Borough Council was conducted on Monday, November 12, 2012, in Borough Hall, 958 Main Street, Honesdale, PA. Council President F. J. Monaghan, Jr., presided at the meeting, which was called to order at 6:29 PM.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

F. J. Monaghan stated that hearing no objection the minutes of the November 12, 2012, Council meeting were approved.

CITIZEN INPUT, BY SIGN IN

The following individuals spoke at the meeting:

- 1. Susan Smith, CVS attorney will speak during the presentation
- 2. Mary Ann Wervey, CVS, is present to answer concerns and will speak during presentation
- 3. Paul Ludick, business owner and property owner, expressed concerns on the proposed changes to the 4th Street intersection will cause a backup of traffic on Main Street; his concern that the subject property owner should redesign the project to have traffic flow through the existing traffic signal at Terrace Street; to consider a traffic circle; and stated that Council should represent the people not the corporation.
- 4. William Davis expressed concerns on the relocation of CVS from its existing location to the 4th Street location which would make it more difficult to navigate through the intersection which is subject to flooding; fracking is in Wayne County and tankers will be transporting fracking fluid through the 4th Street intersection; and requested that council members will work for infrastructure improvements at the intersection and urged council members to keep as a priority the well-being of the town and its citizens.
- 5. Frank Villanti, CVS representative and will address concerns during the presentation

Council President Monaghan stated that he received a letter from the Borough Solicitor at 3:45 PM advising Council to defer action on the CVS project. Since CVS people were in attendance with a draft development agreement proposal with concerns addressed by the Borough Safety Committee regarding the 4th Street Traffic Signal Plan submitted to and approved by PennDot and he believed that CVS should be allowed to present to Council their draft agreement and explain their intentions. Also Council can ask questions of the CVS people. President Monaghan stated that he wished that any and all motions on the CVS matter be deferred for action until Monday, Dec. 17 at 7 PM when a special meeting will be conducted.

CVS PRESENTATION

Susan Smith, counsel for CVS, related facts including the conditional use application and its approval by Honesdale Borough Council; the subdivision and land development application and its

approval by Honesdale Borough Council in December of 2011 but the letter communicating that approval was not sent until September 2012. She stated that CVS submitted the Highway Occupancy Permit to PennDot who owns the roads involved and after revisions PennDot approved the plans that the mylars have been presented to Borough Council for approval. Recent concerns regarding truck-turn radii at the 4th Street intersection when making right-hand turns. PennDot was not concerned about changing the design since it had already accepted a design, nonetheless, CVS proposed a development agreement which assumes that Council will take the action to sign off on the mylars and the subdivision plan which has been accepted by PennDot. The development agreement goes on to state that at CVS's costs, land can be acquiesced from Meagher's if PennDot calls for it, it calls for CVS to submit a revised truck radii plan to PennDot within two weeks to address the concerns raised; a comment period for your engineer to review and it says if PennDot goes along with the revision that CVS will acquire the property from the Meagher's for the improvements.

Discussion ensued with the following individuals participating: Susan Smith, Harry DeVrieze, F. J. Monaghan, Ed Langendoerfer, Mary Ann Wervey, Scott Smith, Tom Shepstone, and James Brennan. Atty. Smith stated that a redacted agreement with Meagher would be forwarded to the Borough along with a draft development agreement.

- 14. Riverside Drive
- 15. Cottage Street
- 16. Fair Avenue
- 17. Grove Street

The penalty for such parking in violation of this ban is fixed at \$25.00. In addition in order to facilitate the movement of traffic and emergency vehicles and to curb the hazards of snow and allow for the removal of snow, the Mayor may declare during the months of December, January and February a snow emergency on all the remaining streets of Honesdale thus prohibiting overnight parking on any streets in the Borough of Honesdale between the hours of 2 AM and 6 AM. The Borough through radio, newspaper or other available means may give information on the existence of a snow emergency and information or the termination of the emergency may be given by use of

the same media. The penalty for parking overnight between 2 AM and 6 AM on any Borough Street during the declared snow emergency will be the same as the violation for parking on a snow route street from December, January, and February during the hours of 2 AM and 6 AM which is \$25.00 per violation. The termination of the snow emergency by the Mayor will not, however, eliminate the overnight parking ban on the above-mentioned streets listed as the snow emergency routes.

Solicitor Henry suggested that rather than repealing sections of the code, the code should be amended to reflect the statement that Councilor Brennan made.

James Brennan stated that he wished to amend the motion to delete "by repealing §195-22.1" and replacing it with "and amend the prohibition of "and to advertise the amendment for adoption at the January 14, 2013 meeting. Scott Smith seconded the motion.
